Examples:

Person: teacher, doctor Place: school, park Thing: ball, computer Idea: freedom, happiness

Why Are Nouns Important?

Nouns help us:

Name people we love (mom, friend)
Talk about places we visit (beach, zoo)
Describe objects around us (pen, bicycle)
Express ideas and feelings (love, hope)

Notes: You cannot make a complete sentence without a noun!

A singular noun means just one. A plural noun means more than one.

box boxes
man men
Countable and Uncountable Nouns
Countable nouns: Can be counted
Example: 1 book, 2 books, 3 books
Uncountable nouns: Cannot be counted
Example: water, sand, sugar

Possessive Nouns

A possessive noun shows ownership.

Examples:

The dog's tail = the tail belonging to the dog Mary's book = the book belonging to Mary Nouns in Sentences

Nouns can be used in different parts of a sentence:

1. As the subject

Example: The teacher writes on the board.

2. As the object

Example: We read a book.

3. As the complement

Example: She is a doctor.

4. In noun phrases

A noun phrase includes a noun and the words that describe it. Example: The big red ball.
